I am aware that a day visit to Lea Green Centre will include adventurous activities and therefore has inherent risks. The activities may include High Ropes/Team Swing or Low Ropes activities, rock scrambling or stream walks. Additional information

Young people at Lea Green Centre undertake activities in or near lakes and streams. Leptospirosis (Weils disease) is a rare but endemic waterborne disease in Great Britain and there is therefore a small risk of infection from contact with water. Should a young person who has attended a course at Lea Green Centre develop flu or fever like symptoms, we advise consulting your doctor and informing them that the participant has had contact with inland lake and stream water.

Ticks are found throughout the UK and are known to carry Lyme's disease. If the participant has a red skin rash that looks like the bullseye on a dartboard or you discover a tick please consult your doctor.
