Relationships and Sex Education Parent and Carer Survey 2024

Many thanks to those of you who took the time to complete the recent Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) survey that was sent to all parents and carers. In total, 212 families responded. The results are below plus additional information that may answer some of the queries that were raised.


Please be aware that new RSE guidance was drafted in May 2024. However, these proposed changes have not yet been implemented due to the change in government. As such, schools continue to follow the guidance that was published in 2019.

Do you know that all secondary schools are required to teach Relationships, Sex and Health Education?	96% - yes 4% - no	Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education and Health Education guidance Page 17, 25-27
Do you know that parents / carers have the right to request that their child is excused from sex education up until three terms before their 16th birthday but cannot be withdrawn from relationships or health education?	69% - yes 26% - no 9% - unsure

What values do you think we should prioritise in our RSE curriculum?	54% of respondents answered 'respect' for this question.
