## School Uniform Regulations for Years 7 - 11



## Uniform and Appearance

At the Ecclesbourne School we are committed to high standards of uniform and appearance. Our standards and expectations are reflected in this uniform guide and it provides our students with the unique identity that comes with being a member of our school community. We believe being smart in both uniform and appearance is very important as it encourages a sense of pride and engenders positive community recognition. All of our staff members ensure these regulations are followed, and we ask that parents/carers support and enforce our uniform and appearance code.

## School Dress Regulations for Years 7 - 11

The school colours are burgundy and cerulean blue.

It is essential that the correct uniform is worn at all times during the school day and at school functions unless otherwise specified. *Please note: this includes journeys to and from school.* 

If you are uncertain about the appropriateness of any particular item of clothing, please seek guidance from either the Head of Lower or Upper School **before** a purchase is made.

All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the student's name either with marking ink or with nametapes.

## A Quick Glance at our regulations for:

## Uniform

- Maroon Formal Blazer with the school crest \*
- A regulation "Trutex" mid-grey stitched down pleated skirt\* (worn at an appropriate length for a professional working environment) or regulation "Trutex" mid-grey trousers\*.
- Charcoal grey polyester/viscose trousers, and not black.
- Plain white long or short sleeved shirt : with a firm collar suitable for wearing with a tie, tucked in at all times with sleeves rolled down.
- School Tie\* or Merit tie.
- Trutex" plain navy blue or mid grey "V" necked pullover / cardigan\*
- Plain black or brown school shoes with a low or flat heel. Trainers or boots are not allowed.
- Plain grey or black ankle socks or natural or black opaque tights.

## Appearance

- Hair should not be extreme in terms of style, cuts or colour.
- Jewellery and piercings: a wristwatch and one pair of plain, small earlobe stud earrings.
- Make-up: Years 7-9, no make-up. Years 10-11, a moderate amount of face make-up is permitted. Years 7-11 no nail varnish, false nails, or lashes.
- Appropriate outdoor coats: not to be worn indoors.

## **Summer Uniform**

- The season starts at the discretion of the headteacher.
- No outdoor coats
- Wearing of blazer is optional
- If tie is not worn, the top button is undone.
- Shirts tucked in.

## **Food Technology - Aprons**

Previously we have been able to provide aprons for Food Technology lessons, however in line with CLEAPPS recommendations this is no longer the case. Students are unable to share personal protective equipment.

We are therefore asking that you provide your child with an apron to prevent potential spoilage to school uniform during food practical lessons. Aprons are available through our uniform suppliers but we are happy for you to supply any suitable and appropriate apron.

## Further detail about uniform and appearance:

## Wearing of blazers

Students should wear their blazers at all times, unless it is summer uniform. Sleeves must always be rolled down. They can ask their teachers if they can remove their blazers in lessons.

## Shirts and ties

Students must wear a formal, firm white collared, short or long sleeved shirt, tucked in and the sleeves rolled down at all times. Fashion-type shirts, including those with button-down collars, are not acceptable. The wearing of printed/coloured t-shirts visible either through the shirt or at the neck is not acceptable. If cold, either a pullover should be worn and/or an unobtrusive plain white round-necked t-shirt or base layer.

Students should wear their school ties at all times (except for PE) with top button fastened. Short ties and large knots are not acceptable. Holders of school-awarded ties are allowed to be worn.

## **Trousers and skirts**

Trousers must be purchased from the recognised school supplier and should be formal and tailored and not tight-fitting or a modern, skinny cut. If a belt is required, it must be plain and black and not with a large buckle or brand. The school skirt must be worn at an appropriate length for a working environment.

## Pullover/cardigan

"Trutex" plain navy blue or mid grey "V" necked pullover/cardigan

The "v" necked pullover must be made of 100% cotton in a similar finish to stocking stitch not ribbed or patterned. "Trutex" 100% cotton "V" necked cardigans in stocking stitch with plain buttons are also acceptable.

Sweatshirts and hooded tops are not acceptable.

## **Outdoor coats and scarves**

No particular style is specified but a plain coat is recommended. Coats must be big enough to wear on top of the blazer and are not to be worn instead of the blazer. Coats may be worn to travel to and from school and when in transit between one school building and another. No outdoor coats or scarves may be worn in classrooms.

## Footwear

Shoes should be flat or low heel, and plain black or brown. Stiletto/fine-point, backless shoes, heels and boots are not to be worn in school. Trainers or pumps are not permitted. Plain grey or black ankle socks or natural or black opaque tights. (For those identifying as female, white ankle socks are permitted.)

## Hair and hair accessories

Haircuts should not be 'extreme' in style and hair dye should be in keeping with natural shades. Both hairstyle and colour should be suitable for a professional working environment. Should students choose inappropriate patterns, colours or styles the school reserves the right to ask a student to modify their hair.

Hair accessories must be small and unobtrusive e.g. small bobbles or scrunchies. Hair, if longer than shoulder length, should be tied back when required.

## Jewellery and make-up

Years 7-9: no make-up, nail varnish, false nails and lashes.

Years 10-11: a moderate amount of face make-up. No nail varnish, false nails and lashes.

No jewellery is permitted except a wristwatch and one pair of plain, small earlobe stud earrings. Other body piercings are not permitted, including, and not limited to, nose, eyebrow, tongue or face.

## Are you wearing your uniform correctly?

Ecclesbourne Formal Blazer with school crest and schoolawarded lapel badge only

Coats must never be worn instead of the school blazer.

No outdoor coats may be worn in classrooms.

A regulation "Trutex" midgrey stitched down pleated skirt or tailored trousers or regulation "Trutex" charcoal grey trousers.

The skirt must be work at a length suitable for a working environment. Black trousers are not acceptable and trousers should not be too tight.

Plain black or brown school shoes with a low or flat heel. No trainers. No boots.

Hair should not be extreme in terms of style, cut or colour. Hair accessories must be small and unobtrusive, e.g. small bobbles or scrunchies. Longer hair should be tied back when required.

> NO make-up is allowed in Years 7-9.

> A moderate amount of face permitted for make-up is students in Years 10-11.

> No nail varnish, fake nails or eyelashes are allowed.

A wristwatch and one pair of small ear lobe studs are allowed.

Trutex" plain navy blue or "V" mid-grey necked pullover/cardigan

Plain grey or black ankle socks.

Natural or black opaque tights, white ankle socks

School tie must be worn at all times with top button fastened. School-awarded ties are allowed to be worn.

A formal, firm white collared, short or long sleeved shirt, tucked in and the sleeves rolled down at all times.







## GAMES AND P.E. KIT

The below items are manufactured by school sportswear provider 'Falcon' and <u>must be purchased from</u> our recommended suppliers (please see page 1):

- Navy and sky blue 1/4 zip top bearing the school crest.
- Sky blue [maroon panel] sports polo shirt.
- Navy / sky blue leggings or plain navy/sky blue jogging trouser.
- Maroon skort or Maroon shadow stripe shorts.
- Long sky blue socks with "Ecclesbourne" in maroon lettering.

The remaining mandatory elements of our games and P.E kit can be purchased from a wide range of retailers and will facilitate participation in our taught curriculum and / or our broader enrichment programme:

- White sports socks.
- Training shoes with good traction and support.
- Shin pads.
- Football boots.
- Gum shields.
- A towel.
- A separate bag to carry specialised footwear (e.g. football boots) and dirty PE kit.

ALL the above items of our games and P.E. kit should be clearly marked with the owner's name.



Students selected for school cricket/tennis teams will be expected to provide tennis "whites", white flannels or trousers, white fixed colour open-necked shirt, white socks, white sweater, if desired.

Gum shields are recommended to be worn for hockey and rugby because of the risk of dental injuries in contact sports.

Training shoes with nonmarking soles.

Sky blue long socks with maroon lettering "Ecclesbourne" on the socks.

Cricket boots are desirable.

Football boots, which must have all aluminium safety studs and NOT plastic.
