## The A Level Exam

### Paper 1: Listening, reading and writing

#### What's assessed

Aspects of Hispanic society

Artistic culture in the Hispanic world

Multiculturalism in Hispanic society

Aspects of political life in Hispanic society

Grammar

#### How it's assessed

Written exam: 2 hours 30 minutes

100 marks 50% of A Level

#### Questions

- Listening and responding to spoken passages from a range of contexts and sources covering different registers and adapted as necessary. Material will include complex factual and abstract content and questions will target main points, gist and detail. Studio recordings will be used and students will have individual control of the recording.
- All questions are in Spanish, to be answered with non-verbal responses or in Spanish (30 marks).
- Reading and responding to a variety of texts written for different purposes, drawn from a range of authentic sources and adapted as necessary. Material will include complex factual and abstract content and questions will target main points, gist and detail.
- All questions are in Spanish, to be answered with non-verbal responses or in Spanish (50 marks).
- Translation into English; a passage of minimum 100 words (10 marks).
- Translation into Spanish; a passage of minimum 100 words (10 marks). No access to a dictionary during the assessment.

## **Paper 2: Writing**

**The play, La casa de Bernarda Alba**

**Written exam: 2 hours**

**80 marks**

**20% of AS questions**

### **Questions**

- One question in Spanish on a set text from a choice of two questions and one question in Spanish on a set film from a choice of two questions.
- All questions will require a critical appreciation of the concepts and issues covered in the work and a critical and analytical response to features such as the form and the technique of presentation, as appropriate to the work studied (eg the effect of narrative voice in a prose text or camera work in a film).  
No access to texts or films during the assessment.  
No access to a dictionary during the assessment.  
Students are advised to write approximately 300 words per essay.

## Paper 3: Speaking

### What's assessed

#### What's assessed

- Individual research project
- One of four themes ie Aspects of Hispanic society or Artistic culture in the Hispanic world or Multiculturalism in Hispanic society or Aspects of political life in Hispanic society

### How it's assessed

Speaking exam: 21-23 minutes

60 marks

30% of A Level questions

Discussion of a sub-theme with the discussion based on a stimulus card (5-6 minutes) minutes on each). The student studies the card for 5 minutes at the start of the test, (25 marks).

Presentation (2 minutes) and discussion ((-10 minutes) of individual research project (35 minutes)

No access to a dictionary during the assessment or during the preparation time.

Students may take the assessment only once before certification.

Assessments will be conducted by the centre.



Students in dual language programs consistently outperform monolingual peers on state-mandated tests, regardless of demographic.




## Preparation for the Future


