- Psychology is the SCIENCE of mind and behaviour
- In Psychology we try to answer questions such as:
  - ► Why might eyewitness testimonies be inaccurate?
  - ► How can we try to reduce stress?
  - ▶ Why do we conform to rules and authority?
  - ► What causes depression and how should it be treated?
  - Which research method is best to use to investigate any given behaviour?



The aim is to go beyond the popular approach to psychology, taking a more academic route towards an understanding of the various theoretical perspectives and the different methods of studying behaviour. These methods include:

- Statistical Analysis
- Designing an experiment/study
- Understanding ethical considerations
- Analysis of the reliability and validity of research findings



- Yes, if you are interested in the study of human behaviour.
- ► You have good critical thinking skills.
- You must be prepared to read widely around each topic independently from a variety of sources.
- Essay based.





- ▶ 10% of the questions across the papers will involve mathematical skills.
- The mathematics and scientific element of Psychology has now been brought in line with Chemistry, Physics and Biology.
- ► Your GCSE grade in Maths, Science (Biology) and English Language is important.
