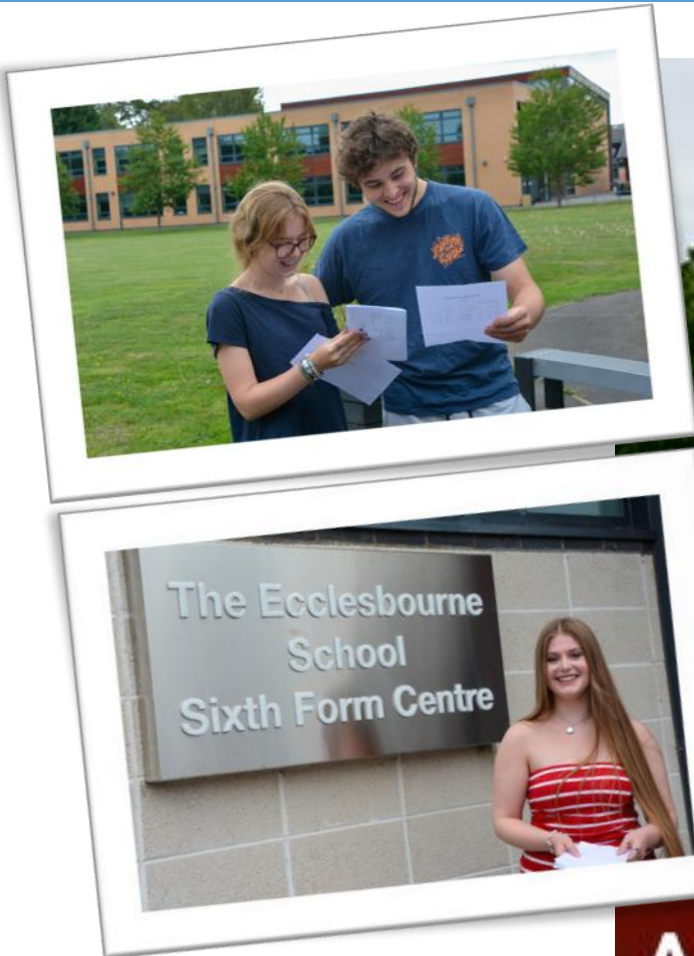

- **we achieved a single year T score of 2.33**



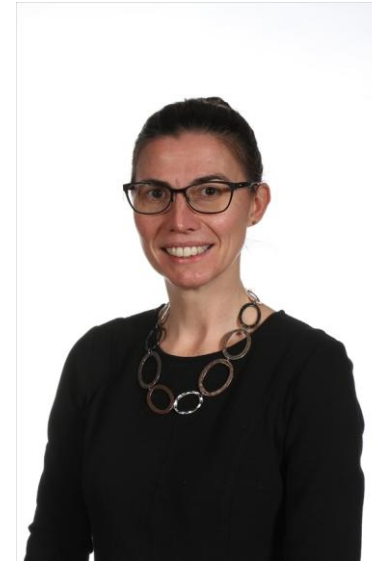

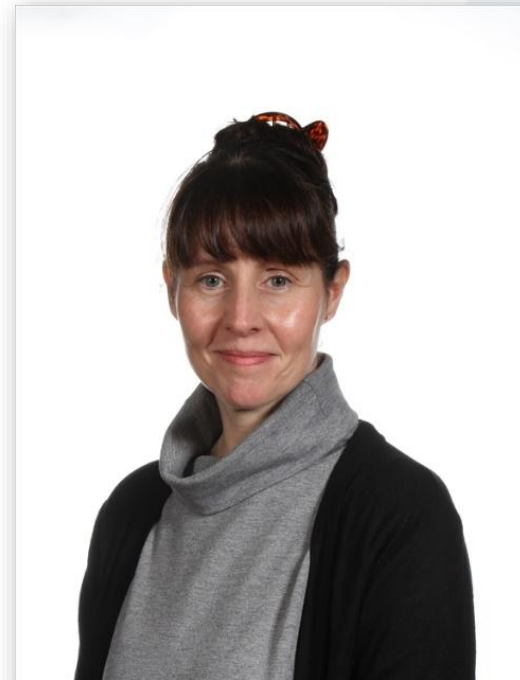

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year. The Government states that every pupil's attendance should be at least 95%.

Students must be predicted to gain the entry requirements.



Students with a predicted grade average of 7+ are able to take four subjects in Year 12.

The Application Process

- **December 2025** - Current Ecclesbourne students - conversations with 'Core Team' *
 - **February 2026** – new students to Ecclesbourne meet members of SFO & reference requested. *
 - **March 2026**- final 16+ conversations, current Ecclesbourne students. *
 - **March / April 2026** - conditional offers issued to all applicants who meet requirements
